## **COALITION FOR A SAFER WEB COMMENDS CONGRESSIONAL INVESTIGATIONS INTO DONATIONS TO ANTISEMITIC AND EXTREMIST GROUPS**

The Coalition for a Safer Web (CSW) today commended the leadership of the House Committee on Education and the Workforce and the House Committee on Oversight & Accountability for calling on the Treasury Department to commence an investigation into donors funneling tax-exempt dollars to antisemitic and extremist groups involved in campus and urban rioting.

In a [letter](#) to Treasury Secretary Yellen the respective Chairs of each Committee (Rep. Virginia Foxx (R-NC) and James Comer (R-KY) the Committees stated:

*“The Committee on Oversight and Accountability and the Committee on Education and the Workforce have grave concerns about the ongoing chaos and related illegal and antisemitic activities taking place on an increasing number of campuses across the country. The Committees are investigating the sources of funding and financing for groups who are organizing, leading, and participating in pro-Hamas, antisemitic, anti-Israel, and anti-American protests with illegal encampments on American college campuses. This investigation relates both to malign influence on college campuses and to the national security implications of such influence on faculty and student organizations.”*

CSW is supporting the Committees’ investigations, as well as providing briefings and investigative support to the House Ways & Means Committee and the Senate Finance Committee that are conducting their own investigations into major U.S. philanthropies camouflaging donations to antisemitic and extremist groups in violation of Section 501 of the Internal Revenue Code.

CSW also filed in recent weeks [official complaints](#) with the Inspector General for Tax Administration against the [Open Society Foundation](#), the [Goldman Sachs Philanthropy Fund](#), and the [Tides Foundations](#) for abusing their tax-exempt privileges AND camouflaging their donations by designating them as “fiscal sponsorships” which enable donors to shield donations from public scrutiny.

When confronted by these revelations spokesmen for each organization refused to acknowledge donations to extremist and antisemitic recipients. These denials constitute coverups likely due to a desire to shield the identities of their donors and the consequential impact to their privileged tax-exempt status.

Black money donations of tax-exempt dollars to antisemitic and other extremist groups now planning to disrupt the Democratic National Convention in Chicago places even more urgency on Congress and the Treasury Department to act immediately against these donor abuses.
